
Syon Park, Brentford

Chatsworth, Derbyshire




Castle Howard, North Yorkshire




St. Paul's Cathedral


Royal Museums Greenwich

This building has 4 tall chimneys, Roman Doric columns and an inscribed frieze. It is the perfect backdrop for your next production.


Imperial War Museums
